

Victorian Skills First Program – Are you eligible?

The Victorian Skills First Program is an entitlement to government subsidised training in Victoria.

What are the fees?

Eligibility under the Victorian Skills First Program. Are you:

1. No longer at school?
2. An Australian citizen; or a holder of a permanent visa; or a New Zealand citizen?
3. Under 20 years of age as at 1 January 2017; or
Over 20 years of age as at 1 January 2017 and seeking to enrol in a course that is at a higher qualification level than the highest qualification held?

If you are seeking to enrol in a Certificate IV course and you have previously completed an accredited Australian qualification at this level or higher (such as a Certificate IV, Diploma or Bachelor Degree regardless of the field studied) you will **not** be eligible.

If you answered 'yes' to all three questions you may be eligible to enrol in a government subsidised course under the Victorian Skills First Program.

Eligibility under the Victorian Skills First Program. How many courses:

1. Have you commenced in 2017?
2. Are you currently undertaking?
3. Have you started that are at the same level as the one you want to enrol in now?

If you answered 'zero' or 'one' to any of these questions you may be eligible to enrol in a government subsidised course under the Victorian Skills First Program.

If you answered 'two' or more to any of these questions you are not eligible to enrol in a government subsidised course under the Victorian Skills First Program. If you live or work in New South Wales you may be eligible for NSW Smart and Skilled subsidised training.

Eligibility under NSW Smart and Skilled. Are you?

1. 15 years old or over?
2. No longer at school?
3. Living or working in NSW?
4. An Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident, humanitarian visa holder or New Zealand citizen?

If you answered 'Yes' to all four questions, then you're eligible to enrol in a government subsidised course under NSW Smart and Skilled.
